Orion Space Launch

On December 15, 2014, the IAH Middle School went to the Huntsville Space and Rocket Center to view the launching of the Orion space shuttle. The space shuttle planned to lift off from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida. The Orion spacecraft was set to orbit Earth twice, reaching an altitude of approximately 3,600 miles above Earth before landing in the Pacific Ocean. No one was aboard Orion for this flight test, but the spacecraft was designed to allow astronauts to journey to destinations never before visited by humans, including an asteroid and Mars.
